## Speaking to staff about their remote working set-up

## Everyone's set-up is different

What tools are the least useful? How could we improve them?
How are you finding teamwork during this time?
How are you finding communication across the company? What can we do to make everyone feel included?
How can we recreate the social aspect of work to promote togetherness?
Do you have any concerns about continuing to work from home?
When lockdown is eased, what would you like your home/office work balance to be? Why?
